RTP commissioned and produced GREY ROCK by Amir Nizar Zuabi, presented at La MaMa Theatre in 2019, followed by a 2020 US tour (Public Theater, NY, Guthrie Theatre, Kennedy Center and Kimmel Center in Philadelphia) and also seen at the Melbourne and Adelaide Festivals.

RTP has created US-based events for Little Amal/The Walk Productions, as well as local community engagement projects in NYC.
